Syllabus for CHIN9512 Cantonese as a Foreign Language II

Course Description:

This intensive course is designed for international undergraduate students, exchange students and visiting students (non-heritage learners) who have completed CHIN9511 or who can demonstrate equivalent competence through the placement test. It aims at strengthening students' mastery of the phonetic romanization transcription, the *Jyutping* system, and at enhancing their competence in expressing themselves both orally in Cantonese and in writing short messages or speeches in *Jyutping*. The course will emphasise growth in oral communication and listening comprehension abilities through a wide variety of communication-based assignments such as show-and-tell sessions, journal presentations and phone calls. Practical sentence patterns and useful words and expressions for everyday life will also be introduced.

Duration:

One semester (offered during both the first and second semesters) 4 sessions/contact hours per week

Credits: 6

Target Learners:

Non-Cantonese speaking undergraduate students who have completed and passed CHIN9511 or who can demonstrate equivalent competence through the placement test AND who are exempt from taking a Practical Chinese language course offered by the Chinese Language Enhancement Programme (CLEP).

❖ Note: Students who have passed the GCSE/IGCSE/GCE in Chinese (Cantonese) are NOT eligible to take CHIN9512.

Course Objectives:

- 1. To improve students' competence in spoken Cantonese
- 2. To strengthen students' mastery of the *Jyutping* phonetic romanisation transcription system
- 3. To teach students useful words and phrases for everyday life
- 4. To expand students' vocabularies and practice acquired expressions
- 5. To teach students more advanced grammatical patterns and how to accurately express ideas

Course Material:

Handouts will be distributed before the lessons.

Course Content:

- 1. Phonetic transcription reviews and drills
- 2. In-depth practice of vocabulary and conversational skills for everyday life
- 3. Practice of more advanced dialogues to increase speaking and listening abilities
- 4. Study of a wide range of sentence structures

Registration Procedures:

Students should:

- 1. Register through the Student Internet by the add/drop period deadline and
- 2. EMAIL/HAND IN TO THE CLASS TEACHER a completed <u>Statement of Current Level of Proficiency in Chinese Language</u> and the placement test during the first lesson.

Course Requirements:

- 1. All students must formally register in the course.
- 2. Students are required to attend all of the classes and complete the assignments as instructed.
- 3. Students must study, prepare and review at home (at least an hour for each meeting).
- 4. Students must listen to and practice with the recordings on Moodle (at least half an hour after every meeting).

Learning Outcomes:

Upon successful completion of the course, students should be able to:

- 1. Demonstrate a basic ability to communicate and express ideas in Cantonese using correct and appropriate expressions both orally and through writing in *Jyutping*.
- 2. Build on previously acquired knowledge (e.g., through CHIN9511) to demonstrate mastery of 400+ frequently used Cantonese words or short phrases and approximately 100 sentence patterns/structures through communication-based assignments like show-and-tell sessions, phone calls, and writing and presenting journal scripts.
- 3. Demonstrate an ability to write short messages and speeches in *Jyutping* (at least 250 syllables) using correct Cantonese grammar and sentence structures.
- 4. Demonstrate an ability to write down or read out any Cantonese sounds in *Jyutping* and use these phonetic transcription skills to continue learning Cantonese independently through online dictionaries.

Mode of Assessment: 100% continuous coursework

3.	Make a phone call to the teacher	10
4.	Jyutping reading test	10
5.	Written tests	35 = 20 (mid-term) + 15 (final)
6.	Class participation and exercises	12 = 2 (participation) + 10 (exercises)
